Out of Country Medical Coverage

RWC OPG & New Horizon Members



As was reported in the April 2023 RWC newsletter, the PWU was successful in having the out of country medical coverage for RWC members extended to 85 years of age. At that time, the question was, would those RWC members who had out of province coverage that ended as a result of reaching the maximum age of coverage be allowed back into the plan?

The PWU has informed the RWC that OPG has agreed to allow retirees who have "aged out" on or after April 1st, 2022, and therefore were no longer eligible for this coverage, to apply to re-enroll.

To facilitate this, re-enrolment packages have been sent to OPG and New Horizons retirees whom meet the April 1st, 2022 requirement.

If there are RWC OPG & New Horizon members whom believe they meet this criteria, but have not yet received a reenrolment package, they should contact Manulife, the insurance carrier, at manulifegrouptravel@canamti.com or call them at 1-877-292-0082.



Resurgence of Nuclear Power

Hydro pensioners who still follow developments in the electricity industry have, no doubt, been impressed with recent developments. The Ontario power system will be expanded with nuclear, wind, batteries, transmission and more, while phasing out gas.

If we are to replace fossil fuels with clean electricity, electric systems will need to be doubled, possibly tripled, in size over the next few decades. This period might be reminiscent of Ontario Hydro in the sixties and seventies when the system was doubling in size every decade. Those were exciting times indeed.

It appears that the limitations of wind and solar are opening the door to revisit nuclear power. Bruce and Darlington are going through complete rebuilds and are now planned to operate until at least mid century, possibly well beyond. These projects have been on time and on budget, in contrast with many nuclear projects in the past. As a result. Pickering is now being considered for life extension as well.





With the need for emission free generation and new confidence in nuclear, the federal and Ontario governments are supporting new nuclear. OPG has been working on a small modular reactor (SMR, 300MW) to be sited at Darlington. It recently announced it hopes to add a further three. These will be boiling water reactors based on larger, proven, General Electric designs. Also, Bruce Power just announced that it will look at adding another large plant at the Bruce site, planned to be almost 5000MW- nearly half again as big as Darlington. At this point it does not seem clear if these units will be CANDUs or some other design.
